Idaho Native Orchid Spotlight



Corallorrhiza (Coralroot) - Five species of Coralroot can be found in Idaho. They are typically yellowish to brownish-red perennials with coral-like rhizomes. The rhizomes are associated with fungi that aid in the uptake of nutrients. The dried stems of the Coralroot were used by the Shoshone and Paiute Indians of Nevada to make a tea to build up blood in pneumonia patients, so the plant was used by the indians to reduce fevers or as a sedative. There have been sightings of this orchid in the Boise National Forest north of Crouch, Idaho.

Directions to Signature Pointe Clubhouse

State Street to Glenwood, go south on Glenwood. Up hill on Glenwood, turning left at light on Mountain View Drive to traffic light at Cole Road.
